- A. Answer (briefly) the following questions (double-spaced, single-sided, 12-point font):
 - 1. What degree do you intend to pursue and what are your career goals (if known)?
 - 2. What extracurricular programs, volunteer service or community activities have you been involved in during high school? List the activities (including work experience or internships) and approximately, how long you have been involved in the activities.

- D. <u>Attach a copy of your transcript</u> through the first semester of your senior year showing the classes you have taken and grades received. You can obtain the transcript through the scholarship coordinator at your school or from the front office. It does not have to be an "official" or sealed transcript.
